




REPLICA ROMAN CHAINMAIL

Roman soldiers called 'Auxilliaries' wore chainmail like this. It is a special design that is held to together by small metal buttons called 'rivets'.

Roman 'Auxilliary' soldiers had to stay in the army for 25 years! After that time they got certificates like this called diplomas that meant they were now Roman citizens.
